SEASON: OCTOBER - APRIL

Day 1 Buenos Aires. D

Arrival and reception at the airport, transfer to the hotel. In the afternoon, we make a panoramic tour of the city. We start at Plaza de Mayo, witness of the most important events of the country since 1810, to then continue to the neighbourhood of La Boca and finish in Palermo and Recoleta.

In the evening, we attend a dinner show to appreciate the magnetism of tango.

Day 2 Buenos Aires. B

Day at leisure to explore the city.

Day 3 Buenos Aires / Ushuaia.

B Transfer to the airport to board the scheduled flight to Ushuaia. Arrival and reception at the airport, transfer to de hotel. Accommodation.

Day 4 Ushuaia / Australis Cruise.

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B D In the morning, excursion to the Tierra del Fuego National Park to enjoy excellent panoramic views of the Beagle Channel, surrounded by mountains, lenga forest, cherries, notros and flowers. In the afternoon, we conclude with the boarding formalities and

later, transfer to the port. Once on board, the captain and crew welcome us. Set sail.

Day 5 Australis Cruise / Cape Horn / Wulaia Bay. B L D

We sail along the Murray channel and Nassau bay towards Cape Horn National Park, where we land if the climatic conditions allow us. The mythic Cape Horn, known as “the World’s End”, was declared as Worldwide Biosphere Reserve in 2005.

In the afternoon, we land at Wulaia Bay, historic site that used to be one of the biggest settlements of native canoeists called Yamanas. We walk to a viewpoint from where we can appreciate the beauty of the vegetation and geography.

Day 6 Australis Cruise / Pía Glacier / Garibaldi Glacier. B L D

We start the day sailing through the northwestern arm of the Beagle Channel to land at the Pía fiord to walk towards its viewpoint. In the afternoon, we enter the Garibaldi fiord to have a walk to the base of a glacial waterfall. Return to the cruise.

Day 7 Australis Cruise / Agostini Sine / Águila Glacier / Cóndor Glacier. B L D

Today we push out into the Agostini Sine, where it is possible to appreciate the glaciers that comes down from the centre of the Darwin Mountain Range, some of them reach the sea. During the morning, we land in Zodiac boats to make a soft walk around a lagoon that emerged from the The Essential of Argentinian and Chilean Pia Glacier, Australis Cruise, Chile Caminito, Buenos Aires. PH VisitBuenosAires Águila glacier. In the afternoon, we return to the Zodiac boats to come closer to the Cóndor Glacier.

We learn about the formation of the glaciers and its influence in the sharp geography of the Patagonian channels.

Day 8 Australis Cruise / Puerto Natales. B

Early in the morning we arrive at Magdalena Island, if the climatic conditions allow it, which was a must-stop for the supply of ancient sailors and discoverers. During our walk towards the lighthouse, we can appreciate a wide colony of Magellanic penguins.

Finally, we arrive at Punta Arenas.

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The land is at 11:30 AM. Regular shuttle to Puerto Natales.

Day 9 Torres del Paine. B L

Full day excursion to Torres del Paine National Park. The Park was declared Biosphere Reserve by the UNESCO in April 1978. The variety of flora and fauna along the landscapes and geography makes this area one of the most ideal places to practice adventure sports. We admire lakes as the Sarmiento, Nordenskjold and Pehoe, among others. The fauna you may observe are foxes, guanacos and other species. During the tour, there is a huge variety of birds easy to see. We take a short walk towards the Salto Grande, which is a part of the water supply system of the park. The circuit continues to the administration leading to Lake Grey, where it is possible to take a short thirty-minute walk through a native wood in order to reach the lake's coast and admire the icebergs that break off the glacier and now are located at the beach.

Box Lunch. Return to the hotel. Accommodation.

Day 10 Puerto Natales / El Calafate. B

Regular shuttle to El Calafate. Arrival and reception. Accommodation.

Day 11 El Calafate. B

Way out from the hotel to the Perito Moreno Glacier, located at the Los Glaciares National Park. Perito Moreno Glacier is an impressive mass of ice that descends from the Southern Ice Field, causing detachments during its advance, which makes it the only glacier in the world that is constantly moving. This is an awesome spectacle, not only for its beauty but also for the detachments' roars. It was declared World Heritage Site by UNESCO due to its beauty.

Day 12 El Calafate / Buenos Aires. B

Time at leisure for optional activities. At due time, transfer to the airport to board the flight towards Buenos Aires.

Arrival and reception at the airport. Transfer to the hotel. Accommodation.

Day 13 Buenos Aires. B

Transfer to the airport to board scheduled flight.

Operational note:

Day 8: During September and April, the landing at Magdalena Island is replaced by a landing at Marta Island, where South American sea lions can be spotted from the Zodiac boats.

Day 1 Puerto Madryn / La Providencia. BD

Arrival in Puerto Madryn and transfer to La Providencia, an estate

that preserves the values of its original founders while seeking sustainability and environmental conservation. Free time to enjoy the facilities and its multivariable

olive grove, from which they obtain extra virgin olive oil produced on the estate.

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Day 2 La Providencia. BLD

Today, we will explore one of the most pristine and untouched areas in the region. Upon arrival, we encounter a paradise of wildlife in their natural habitat, such as Magellanic penguins, cormorants, sea lions, and elephant seals. If we're lucky, we may come across terrestrial fauna like guanacos, choiques, and hares along the way. After lunch, we savor the scenery before starting our return journey.

Total distance traveled: 84km (52 miles)

Day 3 La Providencia / Camarones. B

In the morning, we depart for Trelew, where we will make a brief stop to visit the Egidio Feruglio Paleontological Museum (MEF), an undisputed international reference in paleontology.

Afterward, we continue to Camarones, classified as an 'Authentic Village' due to its status as a typical Patagonian fishing village. The surroundings of Camarones are an area where several initiatives for the conservation of Natural and Cultural Heritage converge, as it is home to a rich marine fauna. Some of these initiatives include the UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, Patagonia Azul, Global Penguin Society (GPS), and Rewilding Argentina, among others.

Day 4 Camarones BL

Very close to Camarones, we find the Cabo Dos Bahías Wildlife Reserve, which protects a colony of over 30,000 Magellanic penguins. Cabo Dos Bahías is also the gateway to the

Interjurisdictional Coastal-Marine Park Patagonia Austral, where a majestic geography serves as a refuge for other species, such as South American sea lions, cormorants, steamer ducks, gray foxes, among others.

From designated trails, we take a tour that allows us to observe penguins' behavior without disturbing them. Afterward, we transfer to Caleta Sara, a small reserve that, due to its beauty, pristine nature, and stunning landscape, becomes an ideal place for lunch. Return to Camarones.

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Total distance traveled: 58 km (36 miles)

Travel time: 4/5 hours

Day 5 Camarones. BL

At the scheduled time, we set out for a boat trip to Isla Leones. While exploring the whimsical coastline, we encounter a colony of very curious sea lions that often approach the boat. Upon reaching the island, we take a hike to the lighthouse, declared

as Argentine Cultural Heritage. We continue navigating through Caleta Hornos, which, in addition to its unique beauty, holds historical significance as it was the location of the first Spanish city,

Nueva Leon, formally established by the Spanish in 1535. In one of the coves, we stop for lunch, rest, and enjoy the beach. Return to Camarones.

Day 6 Camarones / Comodoro Rivadavia. B

At the agreed-upon time, transfer to Comodoro Rivadavia. Free afternoon.

Total distance traveled: 260 km (161 miles)

Travel time: 3/4 hours

Day 7 Comodoro Rivadavia / Campamento Darwin. BD

In the morning, we depart for Campamento Darwin Eco Lodge, which invites us to experience a place that makes us feel detached from the world. In the afternoon,

we take a tour of the ranch's main house, visiting its facilities, the shearing shed, and the stables.

Free time.

Total distance traveled: 305 km (189 miles)

Travel time: 5/6 hours

Day 8 Campamento Darwin. BLD

In the morning, we set out across the vast Patagonia to discover the ravine that so

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surprised Charles Darwin. We visit the triangular rock immortalized in Martens' drawings and continue the visit to the canyons of rock art.

In the afternoon, we travel downstream to encounter ranch facilities that tell us the history.

Day 9 Campamento Darwin. BLD

We venture through the steppe to Puerto Jenkins and cross the estuary to reach the port where we embark for a boat trip to encounter the Yellow- Crested Penguin, also known as the Jumping Rockhopper Penguin due to its unique way of moving. We head to Penguin Island, declared a Marine Park because it is one of the sites with the greatest marine biodiversity in Patagonia.

Day 10 Campamento Darwin / Comodoro Rivadavia. B

In the morning, we head to the western part of the ranch to explore the rocky canyons filled with magical caves, springs surrounded by wildlife, allowing us to experience natural balance without human intervention.

At the scheduled time, we return to Comodoro Rivadavia to board the return flight.

Total distance traveled: 305 km (189 miles)

Travel time: 5/6 hours

Operational notes:

Day 4 & 5: The order of activities may vary due to weather conditions.

Day 8: The island lacks infrastructure and a dock for disembarkation, making it inaccessible for people with mobility difficulties.

Day 10: A departure flight after 5PM is required

To keep in mind:

All boat trips are subject to weather and navigational conditions.
